# Admission of drildren outside their normal age group

Parents may seek a place for their dildoutside of their normal age group, for example if the dildis gitted and taken ted or has experienced problems such as ill health. Those wishing to request placement outside the normal age groups hould contact the Healteacher: Such requests will be considered on a case by case basis and in the best interests of the dildoc memed. Team Parents who are refused a place at a school for which they have applied have the right of appeal to an independent admission appeal panel. However, they do not have a right of appeal if they have been offered a place and it is not in the year group they would like.

## **Appeals**

Applicants refused a place at the school have the right of appeal. Appeals are heard by an intependent appeals parel an arged by Conveil Council on behalf of the Coverning Body. Further details and a timeline can be found in Conveil Council's Coordinated Admissions Scheme. Applicants can only appeal again for a place in the same school within the same academic year if the admission authority for that school has accepted a further application because there has been a significant and material change in the circumstances of the parent or care; drild or school (e.g. a change of arthess into as chools designated area), but has determined that the new application must also be refused.

# **Waiting lists**

If the school is oversubscribed, a waiting list will be held from when allocations have been made for the whole of the academic year and parents/carers came quest that their child is added to this list if they are refused a place. The waiting list will be based on the school's oversubscription or iteria and addid a place conswaiting list is subject to charge according to additional information received about a prications or children being added to the list—so their place on the list might now up or down. No priority is given to the length of time that a children on the list. # **Childrenincae and children who were previously in care**

A'drildincare may also be referred to as a'looked afterdild and is a drild who is (a) in the care of a local authority, (b) being provided with a commodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).

A'ChildAnargement Order' is an order settling the anargements to be made as to the person with whom the child is to live under Section 8 of the Children Act 1989 Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 defines a 'special gradianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be achilds special gradians (or special gradians).

Addidis regarded as having been instate care outside of Fingland if they were in the care of orwere accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation, or any other provider of care whose sole or main purpose is to be refit society (see Section 237/A(8) of the Children Act 1989 (inserted by Section 4 of the Children and Social Work Act 2017)).

# Designatedareas

## Childrenwithanurequivocal professional recommendation

Applicants will only be considered under this criterion where the parent/care can demonstrate that only the preferred school can next the exceptional medical crisocial needs of the child, supported by a recommendation in forecample, adoptic; school medical officer or educational psychologist. Such recommendations must be made in writing to the School Admissions Team and must give full supporting reasons. The admission authority will make the final decision on whether critot to accept an application under this criterion.

### **Siblings**

# Multiple birth siblings

Fadrildisasibing of amiltiple birth (e.g. twins, triplets, etc.) and has been offered a place at the requested school, every effort will be made to offer places to siblings at the same school, which may mean allocating places above the Rubished Admission Number (PAN) where this is possible. However, where this is not possible, pracents will be invited to decide which of the drildrenshould be allocated the available place (s).

#### Tie beakers

#### Final tie breaker

Should the tie breakers above still leave dildren with an equal daim because distances are exactly the same, random allocation will be used to decide on priority. The school will use the IA's Random Allocation Protocol which is available on request.

#### Distances

Hine to school distances used for the breaking will be measured by a straight line measurement as determined by Convall Council's non-insted Geographical Information System. Measurements will be between your home address (the centre of the main building of the property) and the main gate of the school (as determined by Convall Council).

Distances used to determine nearests dood with norm (i.e. where it is not possible to offer a place at a preferred school) and for establishing transport entitlements will be measured by the nearest available noute as determined by Comvall Council smonimated Geographic Information Systems of ware.

### **H**meathess

Each dild may have one registered achies only for the purposes of determining priority for achies in and transport entitlement. This achies is hould be the place where the dild is nor ally resident at the point of application or evidence of the achies siron which achieval attends dood, in the form of written confirmation of a house purchase or a formal terrany agreement. Exceptional circumstances in relation to the provision of a home achies will be considered on a case by case basis. If there is shared residence of the child or a query is raised regarding the validity of an achies, the LA will consider the home achies sto be with the priority with primary day to day care and control of the child. Residency of a child may also be clarified through a Child Amargament Order where it is shown who has care of the child.
